CITRUS SEASON

WINTER IS PEAK TIME FOR CITRUS

As winter settles in and the days get shorter, citrus fruits reach their juicy peak, bringing a burst of sunshine to every bite. We're thrilled to bring you an incredible variety of top-quality citrus, including Satsuma mandarins, Cara Caras, and more.

PEAK SEASON

BRUSSELS SPROUTS

Quality and supplies are steady. Try our cleaned and halved brussels!

STONE FRUIT

New Chilean peaches, nectarines, and plums are in stock! Apricots and cherries are available with notice.

BROCCOLI & BROCCOLINI

Market is normalizing with good quality.

GREENS

Georgia kale, collards, and mustard greens continue with excellent quality.

ARTICHOKES

Supplies and quality are good from California.

ONIONS

Good quality and steady markets on all varieties

BERRIES

Raspberries and blackberries are steady from Mexico. Cranberries and goldenberries are still available.

CAULIFLOWER

Supplies are back to normal levels.

WET VEG

Cilantro and parsley are steady. Leek supplies remain tight with an active market.

CELERY

Supplies and overall market is improving.

TOMATOES

Despite the cold front in Florida, Market is finally showing some relief with better supplies and pricing on all types.

PEPPERS

Supplies are improving with a new crop from Mexico.

CORN

Overall supplies have improved, but sizing remains smaller as is typical this time of year.

ALERT

MELONS

We continue to experience tight supplies on both cantaloupes and honeydews due to a field disease significantly decreasing yields. We ask for flexibility on sizing; prorates are in place. Watermelons also remain active.

PINEAPPLES

Just like melons, pineapples remain elevated with light harvest numbers.

AVOCADOS

An extended rainy season has resulted in low harvest yields and a higher market.

LIMES

Persistent rain in the growing regions of Mexico has delayed harvest and impacted supplies. Growers are concerned about how the rain will impact the new crop starting in February.

SPECIALTY PEPPERS

Fresnos and shishitos continue to be in short supply, with better availability on jalapenos and mixed minis.

GRAPES

Supplies are from both Peru and Chile, but the market is holding high. Quality is great.

STRAWBERRIES

The new Florida crop has started but the cold front has stunted the crop growth. Price remains elevated.

ASPARAGUS

Peru is winding down and Mexico is just starting, so the market is holding high. Quality remains good. White is available with excellent quality!

BANANAS

Weather in Central America is causing the market to spike up.
